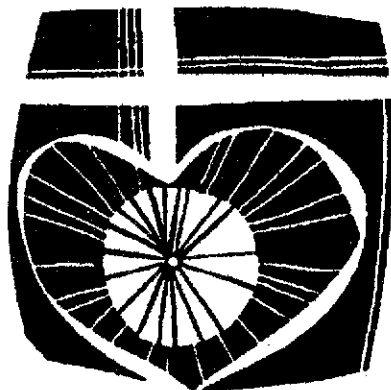


**THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**



What is there to speak of apart from love? To speak about love, there is no need to select some special passage of Scripture to serve as a text for the homily; open the Bible at any page and you will find it speaking of love. We know this is so from the Lord Himself, as the Gospel reminds us, for when asked what were the most important commandments, He answered, *You shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart, with your whole soul, and with your whole mind. You shall love your neighbor as yourself.* And then, just in case you might be tempted to search further through the passages of Holy Scripture for some commandments other than these two, He added, *the entire law and the prophets depend on these two commandments.*

**RIGHT TO LIFE**
