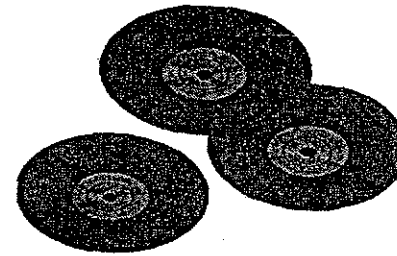

## Ladies day of prayer, reflection and discovering their own spiritual gifts.....Saturday, October 1 at OLR

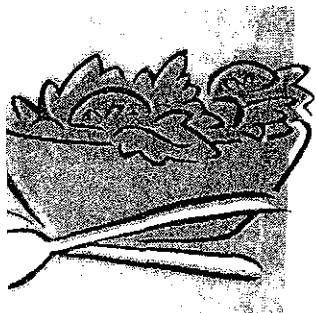
A couple of years ago many women attended a day of prayer and enjoyed a salad lunch and since that time we have received many requests to do it again.

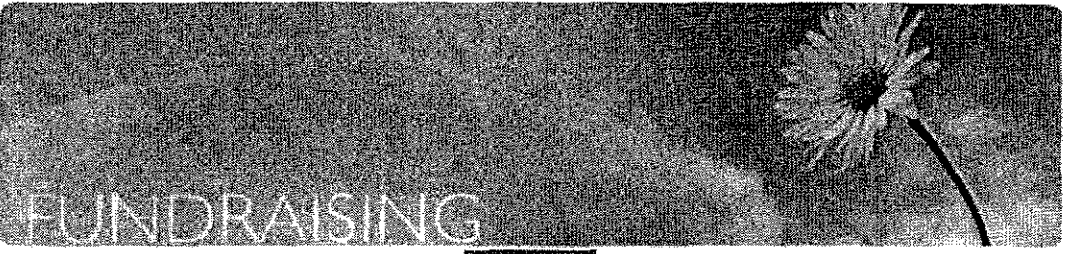
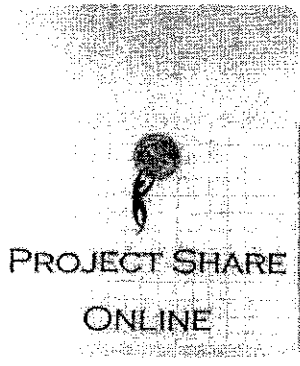

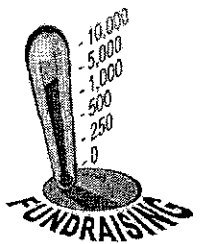
